Measuring ourselves against our Strategic Plan

At the beginning of 2013 we saw the launch of our updated Strategic Plan for 2012 - 2015. The document identified a number of key objectives to increase awareness of what the ITE has to offer for students and sought to expand our membership throughout Australia and New Zealand. The plan also listed a number of goals that international ITE would like to achieve over the next three to five years to advance transportation knowledge and practices throughout the world for the benefit of society and the professional community that it serves. Key Actions agreed to in the short to medium term included:

Partnering

- Increase partnering with other associations
- Communication resurrecting the 'newsletter', but make more use of the website

Students and Young Professionals

- Make students aware of the ITE membership process as part of their course work.
- Consult with tertiary educational institutions about undergraduate research projects.
- Provide a "safe speaking environment" for young graduates and post-graduates.

Sustainability

- Revisit the membership paradigm.
- Increase local membership benefits
- More seminars, newsletters and a better website

Advocacy

- Lobbying for, and assisting where possible to achieve:
 - (a) robust planning for a sustainable future;
 - (b) efficient day-to-day operational management of transport systems; and
 - (c) safety for users.

A follow up Strategic Planning Breakfast was held on Tuesday 10thDecember 2013 at which time the role of the ITEANZ as an enabling organisation with a focus on the development of the transportation engineering profession and Transportation Engineers in Australia and New Zealand in particular was reconfirmed. The ITEANZ aims to carry out this enabling role primarily by involving all of our members in our activities and by encouraging others to become more involved. Encouraging people to become members will remain an important but not overriding aim.

Understanding the Importance of Sponsorships

It is the sole purpose of ITEANZ to channel all of the revenue generated through seminars and special events back to our members. The Board has deliberately taken a decision not to collect additional revenue through annual subscriptions since this will inevitably lead to a charge being added to the annual ITE renewal notice and thereby affect our ability to keep the annual subscription at an affordable level for all. Securing of sufficient sponsorships has therefore been a challenge throughout 2013 and will continue to be so during the coming year.

Of note is the continued support we are receiving from our sponsors SIDRA Solutions and the RACV for our flagship annual events. In addition, SMEC Australia has become our first Corporate Sponsor for 2013/2014.

Providing New Zealand Support

It was agreed that ITEANZ would provide up to \$500.00 to cover airfares for a member to attend IPENZ to present a paper and enhance the relationship between ITEANZ and IPENZ. It was agreed that this offer should be repeated next year, but with more advanced notice. We look forward to this being of significant benefit to our younger members in the years ahead.

Annual Breakfast 2013

Our Annual Breakfast was held at the RACV City Club for the first time in February 2013 with the major sponsor for the morning being the Royal Automobile Club of Victoria (RACV). Our guest speaker was the Honourable Mr Terry Mulder, Victorian Minister for Public Transport and Minister for Roads. The event was co-hosted by the Engineers Australia, Victorian Transport Branch.

The 2013 Student Paper Award was presented to Ms Samantha Gelfand of the Monash University. The award was made possible by GHD who once again offered a generous cash prize to the successful student applicant.

ITEANZ Panel Discussions and Seminar program

A number of seminars were organised and hosted by the ITEANZ during 2013. We have been consistently rewarded with high attendance numbers and a growing interest from a number of young engineers and undergraduates.

A Bicycle Safety Forum was held on Wednesday 24 April 2013 at the Richmond Town Hall. Presenters included a large number of notable persons from our Victorian pro-cyclist organisations and support groups.

ITEANZ Website upgrade Success

Member communications have improved significantly and we are seeing a significant increase in the number of members using the website as a point of reference and/or our partner organisations' hyperlinks. Closer Association with Engineers Australia

According to Engineers Australia, their Civil College Board's Transport Working Group have made a recommendation that there is a need for a new peak representative transport engineering body covering strategic/planning issues. The Transport Working Group has been directed to investigate the form such a

body could take and report back at the Board's March 2014 meeting.

At this point, discussions have not extended much beyond some initial internal consultation on what form such a representative body might take. However, the most obvious option would be to have Transport as a 'technical society' within Engineers Australia with an additional membership fee payable above and beyond the EA membership to help fund activities of the Transport Technical Society (nee Branch).

There is obviously still some work to be done, but the challenge for the ITEANZ Board is to ensure that that the brand and the legacy of the ITEANZ is not lost as a result of this embryonic call for change within the Engineers Australia. This should be of interest to the AITPM as well since they too have responded to the call for a Modelling Users Group to be formed as a subset within the AITPM. I look forward with interest to 2014 in this regard.

Student Awards

Sustainable Transport Award
