Austraffic Worldwide Learning Opportunities

John Reid, Managing Director Austraffic, approached me in February with a proposal to do something for the personal and professional development of the young people in our profession. With his generous sponsorship we have set up the Austraffic Worldwide Learning Opportunities (AWLO) program which provides financial support for young members to attend worldwide conferences or meetings or similar events.

This year we assisted three young transport professionals to attend conferences overseas: Sam Linke to the Annual ITE Meeting in Toronto, Manuel Lawrence to the ITS Asia Pacific Forum in Hong Kong & Joel Docker to the ATRF Conference in Auckland.

We also used the AWLO funds to allow the Monash Student Chapter members to attend the President's Dinner in November for free. This is the first time that a group of University students attended a formal professional transport function of this kind and I believe they gained a lot from it.

The AWLO fund will also now provide \$1,000 in prize money to the winner of the Emerging Transport Professional Award and \$200 to each winner of the University Level Student Award.

John is also encouraging young people through his AITPM involvement. In August he invited a number of young people to attend the AITPM conference at his cost. He then decided to invite some recently retired people because they have considerable experience which they should be able to share with the younger ones. I helped John find a few recently retired people and told them the condition of free entry was that they had to mix with the younger people as much as possible. I believe this worked out wonderfully and everyone benefited in one way or another.

I cannot thank John Reid enough for enabling us to provide students and young transport professionals with such wonderful opportunities to enhance their personal and professional development.

Global Board

In mid-2017, the ITE International Board of Direction endorsed the proposal from ITE Global District 8 Director, Don McKenzie, to form a working group whose aim would be to develop the framework for the formation of a Global District 8 Board.

The role of such a Board would be to provide support to the Global District 8 Director and to facilitate greater communication and interaction between Global District 8 members.

Global District 8 Director, Don McKenzie, convened the first meeting of the *Global District Board Formation Working Group* on 13 July 2017 and the second meeting on 13 October 2017. Due to the many countries and time zones involved, these meetings were held online.

Advocacy

I have used my President's Column in our quarterly newsletter to raise contemporary issues and promote discussion. Victoria Walks made contact after an article about pedestrian versus motorist priority. Someone from TAC made contact after an article about driverless cars. A mayor of a Northern suburbs Council and a number of members of bicycle users groups made contact after an article about the parlous state of the Main Yarra Trail. We have been invited to join a coalition of such groups to try to convince the government to upgrade the Main Yarra Trail.

Working with TAs & AITPM

We didn't organise a regional forum as in the past three years but have already started discussion on the possibility of an event in Geelong next year.

We continue to build on our relationship with AITPM & TAs by attending a number of each other's events.


